

Description of the Profession

Garment and related trades workers fit, alter and repair tailored clothing; design and make textile and fur garments and leather or fur products; repair, renovate and decorate garments, gloves and other textile products; create patterns for garments; install, repair and replace the upholstery of furniture, fixtures, orthopaedic appliances and furnishings of automobiles; trim, scrape, tan, buff and dye animal hides, pelts or skins; modify and repair footwear and leather articles

Description of functions

- discussing upholstery fabric, colour and style
 with customers and providing cost estimates for
 upholstering furniture or other items;
- making upholstery patterns from sketches, customer descriptions or blueprints;
- laying out, measuring and cutting upholstery materials following patterns, templates, sketches or design specifications;
- installing, arranging and securing springs, padding and covering material to furniture frames;
- sewing upholstery materials by hand to seam cushions and joining sections of covering materials;
- sewing rips or tears in material, or creating tufting, using needle and thread;
- tacking, gluing or sewing ornamental trims, buckles, braids, buttons and other accessories to covers or frames on upholstered items;
- laying out, cutting, fabricating and installing upholstery in aircrafts, motor vehicles, railway cars, boats and ships;
- repairing raw hide coverings of artificial limbs;
- renovating antique furniture using a variety of tools including ripping chisels, magnetic hammers and long needles;
- collaborating with interior designers to decorate rooms and coordinate furnishing fabrics;
- making quilts, cushions and mattresses.

Work conditions

Upholsterers and related workers install, repair and replace upholstery of furniture, fixtures, orthopaedic appliances, seats, panels, convertible and vinyl tops and other furnishings of automobiles, railway coaches, aircraft, ships and similar items with fabric, leather, rexine or other upholstery material. They also make and repair cushions, quilts and mattresses.

In order to carry out the work tasks, general competencies are also necessary, such as: interest in artistic and handicraft products, communication at the workplace, application of safety work protection, carrying out team activity, organizing the workplace, planning one's own activity.

Occupational interests

Artistic Interests: Artistic pursuits often involve working with shapes, designs, and patterns. It often requires self-expression, with work being able to take place without following a set of clear, predetermined rules.

Investigative Interests: Investigative occupations involve working with ideas and require a lot of thinking. They may involve researching facts and solving problems using reason.


Realistic interests: Realistic occupations frequently involve practical activities, as well as solving concrete problems, often dealing with objects, tools such as wood, clothes, machinery. The work is mostly done in a laboratory and there is rarely bureaucracy or teamwork involved.

Requirements of job holder

- age: not younger than 16 years
- basic knowledge about wood and clothes
- motivation and interest for work
- Coordination-Adjusting one's own actions in relation to those of other people.
- Active listening/attention-Giving full attention to what other people have to say/show, investing the time necessary to understand the arguments presented, asking questions when necessary.

Unit 1 Replace Seat pad


- Identify the tools needed.

- Fix the cover of the seat pad





Stapler, scissors, glue








Raw materials

Wooden board, Foam, cover fabric






- 1. Measure the seat
- 2. Fix the upholstery surface on the cut wooden board
- 3. Mark and cut foam
- 4. Place the seat and attach the foam in the middle
- 5. Cut off the corners
- 6. Fix from all sides with the stapler
- 7. Correct corners
- 8. Measure the length and width of the cover fabric
- 9. Cut the cover material
- 10. Upholstery fabric with the bottom and with the fold of the foam together
- 11. Centre and fix with the stapler
- 12. Carefully stretch and fix the corners
- 13. Remove excess fabric and staple it firmly
- 14. Final Control
































Unit 2 Sew a bag

- Identify the tools needed.
- Choose the right type of tools
- Use the sewing machine
- Measure and cut the linen
- Sew a bag



Tools needed 16

Sewing machine, seam ripper, scissors







Raw materials

Linen, sewing thread, drawstring








- 1. Measure and cut the linen
- 2. Prepare sewing machine
- 3. Fold the cotton fabric in half
- 4. Sew the right edge towards the fold
- 5. Sew the beginning and end together several times
- 6. Pay attention to an even stitch width
- 7. Sew the left edge evenly
- 8. Sew the end together several times
- 9. Cut off the thread ends
- 10. Thread the drawstring through the side opening
- 11. Insert the drawstring and turn over the edges
- 12. Sew edges
- 13. Check and straighten edges
- 14. Shorten the drawstring to the correct length
- 15. Fold the tunnel and sew up the second side of the bag
- 16. Cut off the thread ends
- 17. Turn the bag inside out
- 18. Check seams and drawstring
- 19. Make a loop
- 20. Final Control
















































Unit 3 Transforming a shirt

- Identify the tools needed.
- Choose the right type of tools
- Adjust the shirt
- Measure and cut the fabric
- Use the sewing machine
- Transform a shirt with laces




Tools needed

Needle, thread, scissors, chalk, centimetre for seamstress, Sewing machine

Raw materials


1 man's shirt L, lace




- 1. Cut off the shirt collar
- 2. Pin the front and back together
- 3. Determine the new section
- 4. Put a mark 35 cm from the shoulder
- 5. Under the mark, sew the lace to the seam side
- 6. Cut the back neckline
- 7. Cut the sleeves to the desired length
- 8. Sew the neckline by machine or by hand
- 9. Sew the sleeves by machine or by hand
- 10. Use zig zag stitch to sew the lace
- 11. Sew the lace on the side seam under the sleeve at 35 cm from the shoulder
- 12. Wear with buttons on the front or on the other side
- 13. Final Control












Unit 4 Make a Straw hat

- Identify the tools needed.
- Choose the right type of tools
- Adjust the straws
- Sew the straws together
- Measure and cut
- Use the sewing machine
- Produce a straw hat



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Tools needed

Flat roller, Sewing machine, ruler, scissors










Raw materials

Straws, straw ribbon







- 1. Braid flattened straws together
- 2. Lay out the braided straw ribbon and roll flat
- 3. Fold over the beginning of the straw band and put it into the machine
- 4. Sew all the way around lengthways to the edge
- 5. Rotate every 180 degrees counter-clockwise
- 6. Cut off the sewn thread ends evenly in a circular motion
- 7. Sew at the edge
- 8. Check the diameter of the cover plate then, to sew up the crown, the straw ribbon
- 9. Sew at a 90-degree angle
- 10. Sew the hat crown to desired height and slowly reversed for the transition to the hat shoulder
- 11. Sew at 90 degrees offset
- 12. Final Control














Unit 5 Traditional Weaving Technique

- Identify the tools needed.
- Adjust the flax fibres
- Use the flat loom
- Prepare fabric in traditional ways



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Tools needed


Spinning, flat loom






Raw materials

Flax fibres




- Spinning: pulling the flax fibres out of the distaff, align and twist by hand, wind the thread onto the spindle by turning it
- 2. Flat loom: press down the right pedal with your foot, Shaft 1 is raised, shaft 2 remains down
- 3. Newly inserted weft thread with the weaver reed
- 4. press against the fabric
- 5. "Shuttle" through the now open "compartment"
- 6. Push through across the warp threads
- Enter weft thread and again with the weaver reed towards
- 8. Drag goods tree
- Weft thread is thereby pressed against the finished fabric
- 10. Another centimetre of fabric is ready





Unit 6 Transforming a T-Shirt into a Bag

- Identify the tools needed.
- Cut the t-shirt
- Adjust the fabric
- Use scissors
- Create a bag





Scissors, ruler, chalk

T-Shirt





- 1. Cut the sleeves
- 2. Cut the neckline
- 3. Cut off its lower edge
- 4. Put a mark 10 cm from the base
- 5. First round lay out the strips
- 6. Put a mark on the other side and continue cutting
- 7. Continue cut strips of 2 cm.
- 8. Second round, join with two knots, the strip of the front with that of the back
- 9. Finishing the length of the bangs
- 10. Final Control



























Unit 7 Scarf from a T-shirt

- Identify the tools needed.
- Cut the t-shirt
- Adjust the fabric
- Use scissors
- Create a scarf



Tools needed

Scissors, ruler, chalk










T-Shirt, beads






- 1. Cut the t-shirt under the sleeves
- 2. Cut strips of 1 cm
- 3. Put a mark on the other side and keep cutting
- 4. First round stretch the strips, join two strips together with a knot at 3 cm and continue
- 5. Second round, put a bead and join two strips together with a knot and continue
- 6. Final Control


